Overview of the Symposium

The ability to obtain financing is crucial for successful business enterprise that fuels economic growth. Clear and coherent legal rules that balance the interests of the various parties are needed to facilitate the grant of credit and the taking of security. Whilst an increasing number of countries have taken steps to modernise their law, the law of secured transactions remains under-explored in Asia. This symposium will bring together Asian and international experts to understand and assess the state of secured transactions law in Asia by in-depth studies of selected Asian jurisdictions, examination of the law reform experience in developed jurisdictions and internationally, and discussion of general issues such as the connection between secured transactions and insolvency.
